# Dear Friends,

It was with great joy (and some trepidation) that we opened up the churches last Sunday. It was joyful in seeing people coming into buildings that have remained dormant for the last 15 weeks. Joyful to be able to celebrate God's love and the great mystery of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ in public once more. It was joyful seeing the response of worshippers reclaiming sacred space. It was joyful celebrating the Eucharist at Corley, even though not everyone was able to partake of the physical gifts. It was joyful being in a physical rather than virtual church community. Joyful to worship God together, even if we couldn't sing! It was joyful to meet some of the community that I feel called to serve.

But there was also a sense of trepidation. The Church Councils had thought long and hard about reopening. Were our guidelines and risk assessments robust enough? Had we done everything in our power to keep everyone safe? We will revisit those questions often and revise our guidance and practice as our experience and the Government and C of E guidance continues to evolve. We have to be careful. Unfortunately, Coronavirus hasn't gone away yet and we still need to do everything in our power to protect each other, to protect the most vulnerable amongst us and the NHS.

On Sunday, everyone who attended the services observed social distancing. The pews had been selectively opened to allow at least a 2 metre distance between worshippers but it soon became clear that we were almost at full capacity with 12 worshippers at Corley and 24 at Fillongley. The last thing we want to do is to have to turn anyone away from worshipping at

their church so we have decided to look again at the government advice regarding face coverings in enclosed public spaces. By asking everyone who attends a service to wear a face covering we will be able to accommodate more of our worshipping community. Evidence suggests that wearing a face covering does not protect you. However, if you are infected but have not yet developed symptoms, it may provide some protection for others you come into close contact with<sup>1</sup>. So, if we are all wearing face coverings then we are each doing our best to keep each other safe from the virus. Face coverings don't have to be medical grade masks, those are best reserved for frontline health and care professionals. A scarf, bandana or home-made mask is thought to be sufficient<sup>2</sup>.

But it is really important to remember that if you have any concerns at all about gathering to worship in the church building, you must not feel under any pressure to return.

From this Sunday we will still be observing social distancing. We will still offer hand sanitiser at the entrance and exit to church, we will still ask for your contact details but we will *also* ask you **bring and wear a face covering.** 

It is a new and strange landscape that we are travelling together, as we learn to live in a world where Covid 19 is, unfortunately, an ongoing reality. If, however, we travel with love and care for each other, then the journey will be worthwhile and joyful.
