Dear Friends

It has been a busy week for Pete and me, trying to settle into our new temporary accommodation in Allesley. Getting used to a new house and a new environment is always challenging. We knew where everything was in our old house. We knew where our favourite dog walks were. But

change is always part of life and one that can enhance our lives if we embrace it. There have been surprises and delights since we moved. The discovery of new places to walk, the beauty of the large rectory garden with its abundance of wildlife – the dog has been particularly enamoured of watching the local rabbits and squirrels as they scamper through the garden. Fortunately, she is wise enough just to watch and not bother chasing them!

Our communal lives are changing and evolving too as the lockdown continues to be released. This week sees face coverings being compulsory in shops and I wonder if they will become a familiar part of our daily lives for the foreseeable future. Change, especially when it is forced on us, can be difficult to embrace. But hopefully the benefits of being able to enjoy so many of the more



familiar and comfortable things that we can now appreciate, such as meeting our friends outdoors or venturing out to our favourite pub or restaurant will outweigh any discomfort.

Our worshipping lives will also change and evolve over the forthcoming months. At the moment we can't sing in church or all receive the gifts of bread and wine during Holy Communion. But we can listen to sacred music and share in a spiritual Communion as the priest consumes the gifts on our behalf. And it is a great joy that we are now able to hold small weddings, Christenings and funeral services in church. We will continue to closely monitor the Government and Church of England guidance for any changes to the services that we are able to offer.

Unfortunately, one of the services we are unable to host at the moment is my licensing as Rector. Legally the service has to take place in church with the Bishop and representatives of the church and community gathered. But as an interim solution, Archdeacon Sue Field is going to 'welcome' me to the post in a Zoom service the week after next. This will mean that I am able to officially begin ministry as your new Rector instead of just operating under a general Permission to Officiate. If you would like to 'attend' the service, just let me know and I can send you a Zoom invitation. The service will be on Thursday 6th August at 7.30pm.

In the meantime, if there are changes in your life that you would like to talk about, please don't hesitate to contact me.
