Dear Friends,

Traditionally, at this time of year, our thoughts turn towards celebrating the harvest. Giving God thanks for all the good gifts of God's creation and for those who steward God's creation on our behalf and to give thanks for all those who work so very hard in often difficult conditions to produce the food we eat. This year has been particularly challenging for many of our farmers. The changeable weather has meant that some crops, such as apples, have done well and there is a bumper crop, whilst others such as cereal crops have done less well. The NFU have reported that the wheat yield this year may reduce by 30%. Added to this are the difficulties that Covid 19 and Brexit uncertainty have created with employment of seasonal workers and it is clear to see that our farmers have had a really difficult

time. But, I once heard a farmer friend say, that by nature, 'farmers are the ultimate optimists'. After all, year after year they sow their seeds and raise their livestock in hope of a good crop. All in the face of years of experience that has seen crops blighted and food prices 'at the farm gate' plummet. So, we are taking our lead from our eternally optimistic farmers and planning outdoor harvest services to celebrate!

The harvest service at Corley will be Sunday the 27th September at 10.30am and will be a Harvest Holy Communion. There will be a table set up under a gazebo for the priest to officiate at the service close to the main entrance of the church. If you could bring along a garden chair (and maybe a blanket and an umbrella too) and sit at socially distanced intervals in front of the gazebo then we can celebrate this harvest time together.

The service at Fillongley will be held on Sunday 18th October at 10.30am. This service will also be a Harvest Holy Communion. Weather permitting the gazebo will be set up near the gate on Church lane and again you will need to bring a chair with you.

For both of the services, as well as your chair (and maybe blanket and umbrella!) you might like to bring a gift of tinned or dried food to be donated to our brothers and sisters in need in the local area. Unfortunately, we still aren't allowed to sing our praises but we hope to share some traditional and not so traditional harvest songs. So maybe, if you have a small percussion instrument such as a triangle, tambourine, castanets or even maracas you might like to bring those along so we can raise a joyful 'harvest home!".

Of course, all our plans are subject to Government and Church of England guidance. At the moment the C of E guidance states:

"Following indications that the number of people permitted to take part in a social gathering is to be reduced from 30 to six in England, we understand the new regulations will not apply to public worship or individual prayer in church buildings." Updated 9/9/20 So our optimistic plans go ahead until we hear otherwise and pray for a couple of those bright autumnal sunshine days that make us feel glad.
