Dear Friends,

I think we can all agree that autumn is definitely here.

The last few days of lower temperatures and the nights really drawing in remind us of how the seasons change irrespective of what is happening in our world or our lives. We are all living through a time of uncertainty and anxiety. Uncertainty about this horrible coronavirus and anxiety for our loved ones, our livelihoods and our future. But the glories of the natural world, the beauty of God's creation, the incredible resilience of nature and the ever changing seasons remind us that this too will pass. Night will follow day, the sun will rise again tomorrow. There will be sunshine after the rain and through his Son, Jesus Christ, God promises us all life in all eternity.



Sometimes, just taking some time to 'be' in the natural

world is all that we need to remind us of the truth - that God is with us in all times and in places and God's bountiful gifts of creation are a reminder of God's love for each and every one of us. Here in Corley and Fillongley, we are really fortunate that God's creation surrounds and envelopes us despite only being a few miles from the city.

Last Sunday, at Corley, we held an outdoor harvest Holy Communion service. It was so wonderful to be able to gather outside (although it was a bit chilly!) to give thanks to God for the wonders of creation as well as giving thanks to all those people who work so hard to produce our food and care for the natural world. The gifts that the congregation brought will be delivered to the Foodbank after being quarantined for a few days and an online donation was made to the foodbank, as a result of 'auctioning' fresh produce and lovely jams and chutneys that were donated.

We hope, weather permitting, to do the same at Fillongley on Sunday 18th October. If you would like to come, then you will need to bring a garden chair to sit on and it might be wise to bring a blanket or a nice big coat to keep you warm.

This Sunday, 4th October, is my official Institution, Induction and Installation service as your Rector. Unfortunately, due to the coronavirus, we are severely restricted on the numbers able to attend. So please could I ask you for your prayers on Sunday at 10.30am rather than your presence. I hate to ask you to stay away from your church, but we do have to stay within the guidelines and maintain social distance within church. Despite St Mary and All Saints being a lovely big church, we can still only safely accommodate about 30 people in total. That total has to include everyone involved in the service including the Bishop, Archdeacon and me.

When this is all over, and it is only a matter of time and us all playing our part to reduce the risk of infection, then we will have a celebration to which all the community will be invited. And of course, in true Church of England tradition, there will be plenty of cake!

If the shorter days and the darker nights are adding to your anxiety, then please do not hesitate to contact me, Rev Jane or any of the team whose contact details are attached. We may not be able to alleviate all your concerns, but we can listen and travel this journey with you.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen


A Prayer for the Feast of St Francis
