Dear Friends,

This week is a week for remembering. On Sunday we remembered the sacrifice made by so many during two World Wars and many other conflicts since. We gathered, separately and together, to remind ourselves that in the darkest of times there were so many people who were prepared to stand up and be counted. People who fought so that the darkness wouldn't overcome the light, to fight evil with all their body and soul and to overcome that evil despite the grave cost. We remembered all those who suffered because of war and conflict, those who still suffer. We remembered all those who work for peace and reconciliation. We remember that the work still has to go on individually, nationally and internationally. We remembered that there is light in the darkness

This weekend sees the 80th anniversary of the Coventry Blitz that dreadful night that brought destruction to major parts of the city and killed nearly 600 people on the night of 14th/15th November and that injured over 1200 more. But something incredible happened in the aftermath of the devastation ~ the cathedral stonemason, Jock Forbes, saw two wooden beams lying in the shape of a cross and tied them together creating a symbol of hope in the desolation. Provost Richard Howard made a cross from three nails from the roof truss of the ruined St Michael's cathedral ~ a symbol that has come to represent the ministry of peace and reconciliation based at the cathedral. These were actions that spoke volumes about the hope offered through Jesus Christ and the indomitability of the human spirit. Light in the darkness. Hope in the midst of despair.

This week has been a difficult week for many ~ the first full week of a new lockdown, something that we all hoped that we wouldn't have to do again. The statistics concerning people ill and in hospital make for very difficult reading and we know that lockdown will have an impact on the economy and people's mental health too. But there has also been some really good news, the wonderful news that the scientists that have been working so hard to produce a vaccine have been successful. There are plans to start to roll out a vaccination programme for the most vulnerable as early as next month. There is light in the darkness.

There is also a new President Elect of the United States ~ someone who has publicly declared that they want to work to reconcile the divisions in the country, someone who has vowed to tackle climate change by immediately re-joining the global climate accord, someone who has said that they want to tackle the inequalities that are rife in America. Let us all hope and pray that in America there is light in the darkness.

We are approaching the season of Advent when we anticipate the coming of the light ~ the light that is Jesus, the Light of the World. Unfortunately, we cannot meet in church to worship the Light of the World until the beginning of December but we can join together in worship via the wonders of technology. There is a link to a recorded act of worship for the second Sunday before Advent in this e-bulletin. I do hope that you will be able to download the order of service and 'pray along' with the local church in diaspora on Sunday. Let us all prepare for the coming of the Light.

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
by Monday 23rd November 2020, and she will send out all the instructions for you.
