#### **Dear Friends**

We find ourselves in the last week of the liturgical year as we prepare for coming close to the mystery of Christmas. The church gives us 4 weeks to prepare our hearts and minds to once again receive the gift of the Christ child.

In this most unusual of years, I should imagine that all our preparations for Christmas will look a little different. At the moment, we don't know the Government's plans for us post lockdown. We don't know how whether or not we will be able to travel to see family or friends or to have people staying in our homes. So we will work with what we have. We plan to the best of our ability and then we amend our plans as necessary. We have all become more adept this year at being flexible and of finding new ways of operating.

This is very true of our worshipping life in our church buildings. At the moment I am hoping that we will be able to recommence worship in church on 6<sup>th</sup> December and we are planning to open with the same restrictions as before this current lockdown. We are much more used to wearing face masks, social distancing and hand sanitizing so that shouldn't feel as uncomfortable as it did after the first lockdown. Unfortunately, we will not be able to have many of our big traditional celebrations this year. Everything is going to be a little more pared back. Gone will be the full church singing its heart out at full blast, gone will be the join in Nativity or the school Christingle service, gone will be our lovely Christmas tree festival. But what remains is our worship, our devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ and the sure and certain hope we have in him.

Perhaps this year, we will all be brought closer to the heart of why we celebrate Christmas. When the overblown trappings of tinsel and turkey, the frantic present buying and wrapping, the constant round of social functions aren't there, maybe the authentic song of Christmas will be heard once more.

# **Advent Window Trail in Fillongley.**
