Dear Friends.

A Very Happy New Year to you all and I hope that it will be a year filled with hope, joy, peace and love. I don't know about you, but I am not one for New Year resolutions ~ probably because I do not have a very good track record of sticking to them. The idea is similar to giving up something for Lent or perhaps one of the more recent phenomena of 'dry January', 'Veganuary', moustache-

growing 'Movember' and other months with a themed cause. Unlike these however, a New Year's resolution is intended to be permanent. It is something intended to be more enduring and it involves an embracing of change.

The very word, *resolution* reveals some depth in its origins. It comes from the Latin *resolvare* meaning to unfasten, loosen or release. Nowadays a resolution is a decision to follow a particular course of action, which might be made by an individual or group or committee; it is a solution to a problem, an end result that is desirable and satisfactory. 'Resolution' is also a musical term, where a chord comes together in a particular cadence or ending and in science, resolving something often involves separating or breaking it down into constituent parts.

Resolutions, at New Year or otherwise, often have a slightly moral dimension, such that they seem to be the right thing to do, and the beginning of a new year, the turning of an

annual page, feels like the a good time to, at least, try to make a change for the better. It is good therefore to make resolutions in the spirit of prayer and to involve God, perhaps seeking his guidance on his purposes for the year ahead.

Each year is like a new page or chapter in our lives, as we find in a diary or calendar. As we turn the page we can reflect on the past year, and as we know, for many 2020 was a very tough year indeed. The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship (BCDM)

The Bishop's Certificate in Discipleship is a modular course for lay people. It is designed for anyone who wants to explore their faith further with a group of others, and is designed to be flexible and suitable for anyone who is not an expert in Christian Faith.



Currently there are a number of BCDM modules available to book on to, all at the discounted rate of £10. There are a mix of daytime and evening modules available, so there should be something convenient for everyone. The reduced rate will end on 4th January 2021. 
- Discovering and using Your Spiritual Gifts
