Dear Friends

Today is a brighter day. I am sitting writing this and can see blue sky piercing the clouds that have been so prevalent over the last couple of months. The worst of storm Cristophe has, thankfully, passed a little to the north of us here in Corley and Fillongley. The ground is still sodden, but God willing, we will not experience flooding in the villages.

It also feels a brighter day because there is a new President of the United States of America. I didn't watch all the inauguration ceremony yesterday but caught the highlights. The entire tone of the ceremony, from the President attending church in the morning, the Invocation by Rev Leo O Donavan* when he quoted scripture and Pope Francis, all on the message of love and hope to the incredible poem by Amanda Gorman** which didn't shy away from the difficult past few weeks but ended with words of hope and an exhortation to be people of hope. Then the ceremony itself with the oath taken by Kamala Harris and Joe Biden, in front of the nations of the world, to uphold the greatest of Christian values. I feel hopeful that the new administration will be one that will seek reconciliation, justice, peace and hope, and that this brighter day is the start of a brighter 4 years for America and beyond.

Yet there is still darkness here and throughout the world; the shadow of the pandemic still looms large. The infection numbers may be slowing down slightly but the horrific death toll continues to rise; but there is hope. The vaccination programme is gathering pace with the incredible target of vaccinating the entire adult population by the autumn. There will be a brighter day in the months to come. In the meantime, we have to be patient ~ to stay at home to save lives and to try and do our part to ease some of the enormous stress on the NHS.

At our *Zoom Service of the Word* on Sunday, Rev Liz (who as many of you know is a chaplain at UHCW) shared just how difficult the situation is in our local hospitals, how the staff are under intolerable strain and many are at breaking point. I asked Liz what we could do to help. Prayer is the first and easiest thing for each of us to do. Keep all our wonderful frontline staff in our prayers every day but Liz also told us of the impact that one school had on some of the front line staff. Everyone in the school had written a short note of encouragement, a verse of scripture or a prayer and had put that with a tiny gift – maybe a bite-size chocolate bar, an individually wrapped biscuit or a tea bag, that kind of thing – in an envelope and sent them to the hospital. These gifts were left in the staff break rooms and the response to them was overwhelming. Just a tiny token of appreciation gave some of those very-nearly broken health professions the boost that they needed to carry on with their life-saving work. I wonder if this is something we could do too? If you would like to get involved then you can drop any messages or gifts off to Revd Liz at "Morahill", Tamworth Road, Corley or to me at The Vicarage, 16 Holbeche Crescent, Fillongley and we will make sure they get to the hospital and to other care workers.

So, as we remain in lockdown and wait for the day when we too can emerge into the bright light of a world where Covid-19 is under control, I'd like to share with you the very end of Amanda Gorman's poem.

Our people diverse and beautiful will emerge, battered and beautiful.

When day comes we step out of the shade, aflame and unafraid.

The new dawn blooms as we free it

for there is always light,

if only we're brave enough to see it

If only we're brave enough to be it
