Dear Friends,

I am writing this as the country comes to terms with the death of Captain Sir Tom Moore. Captain Tom, as he became affectionately known, was a real inspiration to so many during the pandemic. His resilience and determination to make every day count, his incredible fund-raising, his humility and his constant optimism really made him an icon of the pandemic. His catchphrase 'tomorrow will be a good day' is something for us all to hang on to. I have written this many times, but there is hope of a brighter future just around the corner. The magnificent vaccine programme rollout, the news that at least one of the vaccines reduces the transmission of the virus and the levelling out of the infection rate, all point towards a better day tomorrow and that is the hope that we, as Christians, hold onto. With God there is always hope of a better day tomorrow. Rest in peace Captain Tom and rise again in glory.

In our house we sometimes have 'Eeyore days' - named after the character in Winnie the Pooh. Eeyore days are days when you just feel down and everything feels like hard work. Eeyore day is also shorthand for 'please be gentle with me because I am feeling a bit fragile'. It is a way of sharing that you are having a tough time, but the emphasis is on the 'day' part. Today might be an Eeyore day, but tomorrow, to quote Captain Tom, will be a good day. It is confidence in God's promises that the sun will rise tomorrow, that the birds will sing and nature will continue to amaze and delight in all its glory. But if your Eeyore days are starting to become more frequent or difficult to shake off, please do not hesitate to ask for help.

We are fast approaching the season of **Lent.** Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day is on Tuesday 16th February then Lent starts on Ash Wednesday 17th February. As we are still in national lockdown and unable to gather for worship in church, **the service for Ash Wednesday (17th February) will be via Zoom at 7pm** - an invitation is attached below. If you are on the electoral roll for either Corley or Fillongley church you will receive an order of service and a small envelope of ash to use at home during the service. If you are not on the electoral roll then you will be able to download the order of service from our website.

Our **Lent course** this year be based on the Church of England's Pilgrim course. www.pilgrimcourse.org The course lasts for 6 weeks beginning on Monday 21 st February at either 10am or 7pm. If you would like to find out more or register for the course please contact me and I can ensure that there will be a course book available for you. The course is designed for everyone who is interested in finding out more about the Christian faith. It doesn't matter if you have been a church member for years or if you are just 'dipping your toe in the water', there is something for everyone. Each of the sessions is stand-alone so it doesn't matter if you miss an odd session.

The Coventry Diocese has also produced some really helpful resources for Lent this year, called **'Leaning into Lent'**. https://www.coventry.anglican.org/leaning-into-lent-2021/ There are 2 sections – 'nourishing you' and 'resources'. On the 'nourishing you' page there are suggestions of how to create a sense of Sabbath during Lent. One of suggestions is a quiet day on Saturday 20th February, which is open to everyone and can be booked via the webpage.

However you are intending to mark the season of Lent this year, I do hope and pray that it will be a time of coming closer to God and that you will be blessed by the season.

I do hope that we will be able to gather again for worship in our churches again soon. But in the meantime, please do join me for the recorded services of Holy Communion (This Sunday, 7th February, we have a special guest preacher!) or on Sunday at 5pm for a Zoom Service of the Word.

PRAYERS



Thank you, God, for incarnation:


